

What's So Important About Slowing Your Roll?

No doubt we live in a very fast paced world. Our lives are hectic – at work and home. No surprise, our interactions with others mirror this pace: fast, to-the-point, get it done, etc.

Certainly, communicating this way is efficient. But, is this style of communication effective? In fact, it often it is not.

Why?

Because being very to the point doesn't seem blunt and even rude when you're the sender of the message. But, when you're on the receiving end of the message, that's a different story. In other words, it feels like the messenger clobbered you. So, the message was delivered efficiently, but not effectively.

In contrast, a message that is more focused on being effective (than efficient) takes a completely different approach. It starts by the sender of the message thinking, "What am I trying to accomplish?"

By answering that question, you get two invaluable kinds of information. First, you'll see what you should say. Second, you'll see how you should say it.

In fact, most people only consider what they want to say. But, they rarely think about how they want to say it. Let's look at a simple example – we'll use the basic message, "Can you help me?"

Think of the message being said in a kind and understanding voice. How would that affect you? Most people would be inclined to say, "Yes – I can help out."

Next, think of the message being screamed at you. How would that affect you? If you're like most people, you wouldn't like to be screamed at. So, it's unlikely you'd be willing to help out.

The logistics industry is a very fast paced, quickly changing industry. It's not that every day is different – sometimes, every minute is different!

So, try this.

I'll bet you'll have an opportunity in the next week when you'll need to give somebody a quick response. Ask yourself, "What am I trying to accomplish?" That will help you come up with what you want to say and how you want to say it.

In the end, you'll see that you created a more effective way to get your message across.
